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Preface

Studies in Church History 55 takes as its theme 'Churches and Education'. It offers a collection of peer reviewed articles selected from the range of communications presented at the Ecclesiastical History Society's Summer Conference and Winter Meeting 2017–18, which took place at the University of Exeter and at the Institute for Historical Research, London under the presidency of Professor Morwenna Ludlow.

As is apparent from this rich collection of articles, Professor Ludlow's chosen theme, 'Churches and Education', generated considerable interest, and the resulting volume offers insights into a wide range of educational projects through which the Church has presented itself and its beliefs. We are grateful to Professor Ludlow for identifying this theme and also for the commitment she has shown to the society as its president during 2017–18.
