

# TRANSBOUNDARY FRESHWATER ECOSYSTEMS IN INTERNATIONAL LAW

A global water crisis with far-reaching and interconnected environmental, social, health and economic impacts threatens the world. Healthy ecosystems and ecosystems services are degrading, and access to a sustainable water supply is increasingly inequitable both within and between states. This book demonstrates how to overcome the global freshwater ecosystem crisis by matching the scientific recommendations with an international legal framework fit for the task, which reorientates international water law towards a stronger ecosystem approach that also protects vulnerable societies. It illustrates how to understand the fragmented legally binding and non-binding instruments of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe environmental treaties as one coherent legal regime, which contributes to strengthening general rules and principles of the law concerning transboundary freshwater ecosystems. With the recent global opening of the UNECE regime, this book explores its potential role within the European region, Central Asia, Caucasus, Africa and beyond.

RUBY MOYNIHAN is an Irish Research Council Fellow at the School of Law, University College Cork, Ireland and adjunct lecturer/senior research fellow at the New Zealand Centre for Public Law, Victoria University of Wellington. She is also an enrolled barrister and solicitor of the High Court of New Zealand. Her work has contributed to high-level projects for the United Nations and other international organisations.

# Preface

At the beginning of this new decade came a dramatic warning to humanity of a rapidly escalating global freshwater ecosystem crisis and an urgent call for concerted action to bend the curve of ecosystem degradation. A fair and resilient legal architecture to protect the world's freshwater resources is one of the most pressing cross-cutting challenges of our time. According to the United Nations (UN), by 2050, at least one in four people is likely to live in a country affected by chronic or recurring shortages of fresh water. The inspiration for this book grew from a decade of observing how, despite collectively having the tools at our disposal to address the global water crisis, water inequity between and within states is not disappearing but growing, with wealthy nations increasing their consumption of water resources including by importing water-intensive goods produced in poorer, often water-scarce, nations. Poor and marginalised communities are increasingly pushed to the brink of survival by the continued destruction of freshwater ecosystems and their life-supporting ecosystem services. These societies are also the most affected by the rising frequency of extreme drought and flooding events. Almost half of the global population lives within the shared transboundary river basins stretching across the political boundaries of 153 countries. Shared transboundary freshwater ecosystems are under increasing stress from the competing demands for water to produce food, energy and other industrial purposes. This book proposes a novel framework for the reorientation of the existing international framework towards a stronger ecosystem approach to the use and protection of shared freshwater resources. In doing so, it recognises the fundamental role of healthy ecosystems and ecosystem services in reversing the global water crisis and addresses the growing inequities in access to a safe and sustainable water supply both within and between states.

The global water crisis is intimately connected to and will determine how well humanity is able to address and mitigate the impacts of almost all other

major global crises, including the climate crisis, global health pandemics, food security and involuntary migration. Despite warnings that we are teetering on the brink of widespread freshwater ecosystem collapse, we do have a small window of opportunity and the tools to recover. This book explores the role and limits of our international legal architecture in getting us there. Amidst a surging tide of nationalism, where many states are turning away from engaging with long-established international institutions, this book provides a counter-narrative. It explores the growing importance of international cooperation over freshwater resources, especially through regional regimes. More specifically, it seeks to understand the rising role of the UN Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) regional approach to international law on transboundary freshwater ecosystems. Conceived in 1946 to facilitate economic recovery and cooperation in post-war Europe, the UNECE has solidified its position as a facilitator of institutional cooperation regarding environmental protection between the countries of East and West Europe, now extending into Central and Western Asia and most recently Africa. With the recent opening of almost all UNECE regional environmental treaties to all UN member states, the central purpose of this book is to explore the UNECE environmental instruments as a structurally distinctive regime. It demonstrates how these instruments and their institutions can be interpreted and understood to form a common framework of rules, principles and approaches that collectively contributes to the clarification and development of international environmental law generally and international, regional and national law on transboundary freshwater ecosystems. When the UNECE environmental binding and non-binding instruments are read together as one regime, they provide the strongest existing legal framework of its kind anywhere in the world. Such a frame is desperately needed to address numerous shortcomings in international water law and ensure implementation of the water-related sustainable development goals (SDGs). This book explores the role of the UNECE in supporting the realisation of the 2030 global agenda for sustainable development, especially SDG 6, which aims to 'ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all' by 2030, and indicator 6.5.2 on transboundary water cooperation.

International courts and tribunals have played a key role in developing and expounding rules and principles of international environmental law that are relevant to environmental protection in transboundary river basins. This book explores how far courts have been prepared to go to clarify the content of customary and conventional rules and to generate cross-fertilisation between relevant rules and principles that apply both to international water disputes and other areas of international environmental law, especially law of the sea.

It also identifies instances where courts have arguably not gone far enough and examines how such gaps in understanding could be filled by an increasingly sophisticated UNECE regime. Further, this book examines the role of the UNECE regime at the river basin level. It explores the value and limitations of being a member of the regime for countries and river basins who are already bound to comply with detailed European Union (EU) law, those bordering the EU, and countries further afield in Eastern Europe with Soviet-era administrative legacies, as well as Central Asia and the Caucasus.

This book explores the UNECE's recent global ambition. As most of the UNECE conventions become available for all UN member states to join and considering the recent accession by Chad and Senegal to the UNECE Water Convention, this book provides a timely critique of this expanding regime. This research largely supports the UNECE's endeavour to embrace a global role, because it has already been effectively supporting the development of international law and promoting internationally shared values on transboundary waters across countries with diverse cultural, social, economic and environmental contexts for some time. However, this global agenda must be sought and driven by countries outside the UNECE, to ensure the plurality of approaches to international and regional cooperation are respected. The UNECE's overarching future success will require a more rapid and deeper collective state response, generating a paradigm shift towards an ecosystem approach that puts our drastically deteriorating freshwater ecosystems and the increasingly vulnerable people that rely upon them more firmly at the heart of this regime.
