

Israel's Armor

The United States and Israel have long had a "special relationship." The USA became the first country in the world to recognize the state of Israel in 1948, and has been an important ally and benefactor ever since. A critical component of the special relationship is the pro-Israel lobby. Although the lobby has been a controversial topic in public affairs, it has been widely understudied. *Israel's Armor* fills a gap in the existing literature by examining the origins and early history of the Israel lobby, looking at its influence on American foreign policy and weaving its activities into the diplomatic history of the first generation of the Palestine conflict. Covering the period roughly from World War II to the pivotal June 1967 War, Walter L. Hixson demonstrates that from the outset the Israel lobby played a crucial role in mobilizing US support for the Zionist state.

Walter L. Hixson is Distinguished Professor of History at the University of Akron. He is the author of several books focused on the history of US foreign relations, including: American Foreign Relations: A New Diplomatic History (2016); American Settler Colonialism: A History (2013); The Myth of American Diplomacy: National Identity and US Foreign Policy (2008); Parting the Curtain: Propaganda, Culture and the Cold War, 1945–1961 (1997); and George F. Kennan: Cold War Iconoclast (1989).




FIGURE 1 Map of Israeli expansion in the Middle East 1920-67
