Listings under ‘*Book of (the) Common Prayer, The*’ are limited to general comments about the three Tudor versions. Specific printed editions are gathered under ‘BCP’, in a long entry that is also a glossary of the codes by which those editions are identified elsewhere in the index. Each code begins with ‘BCP’ and the year of publication. If the date is followed by G, W, or JC, the *title-page* (but not always the colophon) claims (but not always truthfully) that it was printed by Grafton, Whitchurch, or Juge and Cawood. Unless otherwise specified, editions are in folio and were printed in London.

Anyone simply identified as a ‘printer’ was a freeman of the Stationers’ Company. In May 1557 the Stationers’ charter of incorporation restricted printing to (a) Stationers and (b) anyone expressly permitted by royal patent, so four of those who printed BCPs in 1559 had no formal right to do so. Printers who were not Stationers are here identified by company affiliation (Grocer, Salter, Haberdasher) or as immigrants or ‘forens’ (English, but not freemen of London).

In discussions of the lectionary, with one exception books of the Bible and their chapters are not indexed. Saints are indexed by their given names; signs or places named after them by ‘St’. In addition to the traditional departures from alphabetical order (‘Mc’ and ‘St’ listed as if spelled ‘Mac’ and ‘Saint’), after Cancel Calendars I have arranged ‘cancels’ in ascending order of size (slips, leaves, sheets, and quires). Subentries and sub-subentries are usually arranged chronologically rather than alphabetically. Page numbers in italics refer to illustrations.

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
