

## Subject Index

This index is necessarily highly selective, because many of the topics that are listed here come up constantly in the presentation of texts in the literary chapters. The topics dealt with in the book are catalogued in detail in the table of contents.

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## *Index Mainly of Selected Pairs and Longer Sequences*

The word forms used in this index are often the base-form (e.g. first person present tense for verbs, nominative singular for nouns), but I have not followed that practice without variation. Some formulaic pairs, for example, are used only or mainly in a particular form. The point of a pair of ablative gerunds would be missed if the pair were quoted in the first person present. Pairs from poetry are often kept in the form that they have in the text, and many of the Greek examples fall into this category. Single-word entries are largely, but not entirely, excluded, but it is easy enough to identify words that occur in several combinations from the following list. There are indeed many words that occur in a variety of different pairs. It should be stressed that not all the pairs listed here are interpreted in the text as asyndetic.

Included in this index are a lot of sequences, short and long, showing assonance of one kind or another, such as repeated prefixes, suffixes or inflections.

Quite a few pairs are in both orders. I have not listed all of these twice.

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
