

INDEX OF MATTERS

It is Isaac Disraeli, an early-nineteenth-century British scholar and father to the famous Prime Minister, who may well hold the distinction of having lavished the greatest praise on indexers: ‘I, for my part, venerate the inventor of indexes; and I know not to whom to yield the preference, either to Hippocrates, who was the first great anatomiser of the human body, or to that unknown labourer in literature, who first laid open the nerves and arteries of a book.’¹

My vote goes to Hippocrates. Be that as it may, the construction of an index features a brand of interpretive input that distinguishes it from anatomy. In particular, this index very much stands as my own artisanal design after I (easily) resolved to eschew a professional or digitized configuration. The predictable advantages and inconveniences therefore inform this exercise in *invention*.
