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Teacher's notes

Reinforcement worksheet I

- Pupils guess which school subjects Sophia, Frank, and Oliver like / don't like. Then they read the texts and fill in the gaps. Pupils read the speech bubbles and decide which character said each one. Finally, pupils complete the last three speech bubbles based on their own interests and favourite subjects.
- Key: 2) I Sophia likes music. She doesn't like history.
 2 Frank likes science. He doesn't like computer studies.
 3 Oliver likes art. He doesn't like geography.
 3) Oliver, Sophia, Frank.
- Optional follow-up activity: On four separate strips of paper, each pupil writes four sentences: two about what subjects they like and two about subjects they don't like. Pupils should use like / don't like + ing. Working in groups, they jumble the papers in the middle of the table, then take turns to pick one up and read it out. The group has to guess who wrote it.

Reinforcement worksheet 2

- Pupils look at the example words in the wordsearch: geography and sport. Point out that the words can go backwards and upwards, as well as forwards and down.
 Pupils find the school subjects. They then complete the sentences with the words, by reading the definitions.
- **Key: 2)** 2 dictionary, 3 sport, 4 music, 5 geography, 6 art, 7 history, 8 maths, 9 exams, 10 French.
- Optional follow-up activity: Pupils work in groups miming subjects from the list for the others to guess.

Extension worksheet I

- Check before using this worksheet that pupils can cope with the maths and know the relevant symbols.
 - Go through the example to establish that, in this case, a pattern is made by adding two each time. Pupils work out what they must add for the other questions and then complete the patterns.
 - Pupils do the maths puzzles and write their answers in the crossword.
- Key: 1) I eight, ten (increases by two each time), 2 twelve, fifteen (increases by three each time), 3 forty, fifty (increases by ten each time), 4 twenty-four, thirty (increases by six each time), 5 twenty-eight, thirty-five (increases by seven each time). 2) 2 eleven, 3 fifteen, 4 twelve, 5 three, 6 twenty. The number across is eleven.
- Optional follow-up activity: Pupils write maths puzzles for their friends. Encourage them to use words rather than figures.

Extension worksheet 2

- Remind pupils about the City School ezine. Pupils read the
 interview between the children and their head teacher
 and write in the correct questions from the list on the
 right. Then they listen to the interview to check their
 answers. They can practise the interview in groups of
 four.
- Key: 2 Mr Kelly: How can I help you? 3 Shari: How old is City School? 4 Dan: How many students are there? 5 Shari: When do children start school? 6 Dan: And when do children leave this school?

• Optional follow-up activity: Pupils prepare questions for a teacher at their school. Practise the questions with them. If possible, ask them to carry out their interview with a real teacher (or role-play the interview in class with other pupils).

Song worksheet

- Pupils listen to the song and tick subjects that the singers like.
 - Point out some words in the first verse of the song with different numbers of syllables (e.g. study=2, afternoon=3). Ask pupils to clap the number of syllables. Then pupils circle the words as instructed in each verse. Now the class can sing the song.
- **Key: 1)** Pictures ticked should be: geography, history, science, sport, languages. **2)** I because/Friday/study/morning, 2 l/and/to/too/my/in/the, 3 computer, 4 languages, Japanese, dictionary.
- Optional follow-up activity: Pupils play Hangman in class, using school subjects. When a pupil guesses the word, he/she says how many syllables the word has.

Topic worksheet

- Help pupils pronounce the word archaeologist (ar-kee-ol-o-gist). Using the illustrations pre-teach: skeleton, to dig, local, skull, tomb, cave and gold. Pupils read the text and label the remaining illustrations. Pupils then read the text again and correct the sentences.
- Key: 1) staircase, King Tutankhamun, jewellery, archaeologist. 2) 2 Archaeologists often find paintings in caves. 3 Teeth can tell archaeologists how old the person was and what they ate. 4 The Incas lived in Machu Picchu more than five hundred years ago. 5 Howard Carter found King Tutankhamun after digging for six years / for a long time. 6 King Tutankhamun was found inside a big room / a tomb (behind a staircase and a wall).
- Optional follow-up activity: Pupils discuss and then write about the question: Would you like to be an archaeologist? Why? / Why not?




