There is/There are: Positive, Negative, Yes/No Questions and Short Answers

Positive (+)	Negative (-)
There is a bowling alley in my town.	There isn't a stadium in my town.
There are three parks in my town.	There aren't skateparks in my town.

Yes/No Questions (?)	Short Answers	
Is there a shopping centre in your town?	Yes, there is.	No, there's not. / No, there isn't.
Are there cinemas in your town?	Yes, there are.	No, there aren't.

We use *isn't* or *aren't* in the negative form. We use *'s not* / *isn't* or *aren't* in the short answers negative form.
